A Study in Loving One Another in the Body of Christ

An in-depth study of the “one another’s of scripture? Sounds potentially dull on the onset. However, like much of the scriptures I have personally endeavored to study with more depth I am now in awe of it. Not the study, but the Word.

The respect that we should have for each other is profound. It is not simply a command, rather it is an expectation of the heart. The Word calls for us to die to ourselves, to treat others in a very supernatural way rejecting the flesh, showing utmost deference and kindness.

We can only imagine the Lord Jesus walking the shores of Galilee with those twelve dusty men of old. We can only imagine the way he treated them, each of them (Judas included) with such honor and respect. He was not a “lording over” Lord (a seeming contradiction, I know), he was a servant, a teacher, a storyteller. He was one who was quick to wash their dry, cracked sinful feet.

He did so because it was his nature to do so as the sinless Son of God; we should do so because he has entrusted to us his ministry and he has given us His Spirit, his Church, and his Word to enable and inspire us.

His is a school that few enroll in seriously.

This study is about mutual love and respect

We sometimes get into the trap of critiquing other people’s behavior upon legalistic expectations; do people engage in this/those category of behavior? Do people talk this particular way or in this particular manner? Do they dress this way or that? Some of this is good and some of it is biblical, some of it is but opinion and taste. Scripture focuses primarily on the what we (1) believe to be true and (2) because of those truths how we treat each other in Christ.

Do we love other people? Are we treating some people better than others, perhaps with more respect or less? Are we looking down at others so as to build ourselves up? Do we seek other’s best or our own?

As Christians it is love for others that matters most. It is evidence that God, through faith, has taken up residence in our hearts. If the fruit of the Spirit is “love” then love should be expected of a Christian, a love for God and then, in a parallel fashion, love for others.

This Study is about recognizing these behaviors are not just the right thing to do, they mirror the very nature of God

Beyond these things we recognize that morality and truth are not things that spring from the ground, or things that spring from our own heads, but things that come from the very nature of God and they are things that reflect who he is and therefore the things that he does.

All of these characteristics that we are to do to “one another” echo his very nature and his very actions on our behalf. It would do well for us to see this, for we will find that we can justify our own ugly behavior by excusing ourselves, and we do so quickly.

This study is about recognizing our own failures (and repenting to the Lord) and on a parallel trek, caring and praying for while speaking honestly and open with each as we work through interpersonal struggles

Do you individually treat everyone this way? Do you treat people with the respect, kindness and love described here? Are there any exceptions?

Recognition, prayer (confession), ask forgiveness, aim to reconcile. Most people would rather sweep this dust and dirt under a rug, I would encourage us all to deal with it as best you can.

Make goals. Who do you mistreat? Why do you do so? Are they unimportant? Are you more special or more spiritual or superior? Arrogance and superiority are not biblical concepts for anyone to adapt. Humility reigns supreme.

Obviously, another question you could ask yourself is this; ***Is this how you personally are treated?***

While above we can see handling your own sin is one thing (and a very difficult thing it can be, since I believe very few people undertake it fully), handling a situation where others fail us is even more difficult.

Your response should be first an acknowledgment of love, and a bit of understanding that all of us fail and that righteousness is hard to find this side of heaven. Beyond that there are at least two avenues I see, prayer and an attempt at reconciliation.

This study is only partially mine. It is also yours. Please engage in it and take some time to consider these things afresh!

This study focuses on the passages with the pronoun that is translated “one another” in the New Testament, which denotes a reciprocal action that we should expect from ourselves as we interact with others, and expect from others as they relate with us.

1. Love One Another

Key Verses

- **1 John 4:11** / Beloved, if God so loved us, we also ought to love one another.
- **1 Peter 4:8** / Above all, keep loving one another earnestly, since love covers a multitude of sins.

Q / Consider the ramifications of these commands upon your relationships with others? What aspects are found in these two verse alone?

Task / Take a few minutes and examine the verses listed below (*handily printed at the end of this document*), which are the related verses to these commands. Consider God’s will for your life. Where are you being successful? Where might you be failing? If you come up with the answer “I am not failing” begin again, as you may be lying to yourself (1 John 1:8). Take these to the Lord. (1 John 1:9)

Theological Reasons for the Command

- Because God is love. Love is not primarily an emotion, but rather a choice of the will to seek some one else’s benefit and not our own. It then is related closely with the ideas of humility, service, and self sacrifice. The negative or opposite of these are arrogance, lording over and personal glory.
- Because God has loved us even in our sinful estate.
- Because God has commanded that we love one another in the body of Christ.

Related Concepts / We owe a debt to love one another, we ought to outdo honor for one another. Our love for each other covers our sins.

2. Greet One Another

Key Verse / Romans 15:7 / Therefore welcome one another as Christ has welcomed you, for the glory of God.

Q / What does it mean to welcome? It’s more than just a simple greeting. Why else would it be followed by the idea of being the same as “Christ welcomed you?”

Task / Take a look at the other verses listed below in this section. Consider why the phrase “greet each other with a holy kiss is included so often? What does this mean culturally? How should we emulate these ideas today?

Related Concepts / Greeting, accepting and welcoming each other. Seems kind of basic, right? The church is about the unity and fellowship of diverse people welcoming others into the fold as God has welcomed us. This doesn’t always happen.

In biblical times it was always the one of higher standing that would initiate such a greeting, and the inferior one would wait to be welcomed or acknowledged. When the NT writers told the church people to “greet each other” he was giving them all that right regardless of social status. This was a bit of a subtle takedown of the misguided and dangerous idea that there are some in the church who are more important than others.

Theological Reasons for the Command

- If God welcomed us even while we were strangers and his enemies, how much more should we welcome and greet each other.

One Another Verses / Romans 15:7, Romans 16:16, 1 Corinthians 16:20, 2 Corinthians 13:12, 1 Peter 5:14

3. Bear With One Another

Key Verse / Ephesians 4:1-2 / I therefore, as a prisoner for the Lord, urge you to walk in a manner worthy of the calling to which you have been called, with all humility and gentleness, with patience, *bearing with one another* in love.

Q / Notice the qualities that it takes to bear with one another, there are three listed in the text. Why are these important in the task that we are given to bear with each other?

Task 1 / Take a bit of time and look up this verse in a couple of other translations, or better yet try to learn a bit about the original word in the Greek? What can be learned?

Task 2 / Consider the other verses below and fill out a bit more about what it means to “bear with,” perhaps there are more reasons for it or ways to accomplish this monumental task of forgiveness.

Theological Reasons for this Command?

- If Christ has accepted someone, should not we? God forgave us, can we forgive each other?
- God is the judge of mankind. Jesus is the mediator. We are neither of these things.
- We have been made into the body of Christ, we are not the same but gifted differently, we need each other.

Related Concepts / Respect. Do not judge.

4. Serve One Another

Key Verses

- **1 Peter 4:10** / As each has received a gift, use it to *serve one another*, as good stewards of God's varied grace.
- **Ephesians 5:21** / submitting to one another out of reverence for Christ.

Q / Serving one another is a theme in the New Testament. Here we see that it is to be a mutual thing? Not some serving the one, but each serving each other. What becomes of a relationship that is a "one way street" where serving is expected and none is given?

Task 1 / Read through **Philippians 2:1-11**, particularly verses 4-8 to see Christ's example of life before others that were his obvious inferiors. Write down what you see.

Task 2 / Consider the passage in **Mark 10:42-45** and see what can be learned about being servants of each other.

Task 3 / Review the verses below and take note of what else can be learned about this idea.

Theological Reasons for the Command

- We are free in Christ, and through Christ we are to serve God alone.
- Our freedom makes us able to submit to others volitionally. This does not mean that we become their servants, but we can and should volitionally serve them.

Other Ideas

- This should be reciprocal, otherwise it becomes servitude and is inappropriate and does not show proper respect.
- We should clothe ourselves with humility toward one another.
- We have been gifted to serve each other.

Related Concepts / Humility. Submission. Service.

One Another Verses / Galatians 5:13, Ephesians 5:21, 1 Peter 4:10, 1 Peter 5:5

5. Encourage One Another

Key Verse / **Hebrews 3:13** / ...*exhort one another every day*, as long as it is called "today," that none of you may be hardened by the deceitfulness of sin."

Q / Consider the verse above and look at both the command and the reason for the command? Should a day go by where we don't encourage someone? How often do we go about the task?

Task 1 / Again, take time to consider the additional verses that have the idea of encouragement along side of the idea of one another below. What more can be learned?

Task 2 / Go out of your way for the next three days encouraging someone you might not regularly encourage. Spread it around!

Theological Reasons for the Command

- God is an encouraging being, and gives us endurance to walk with him. Romans 15:5
- His encouragement is comforting and also an encouragement that spurs us on.
- The Holy Spirit is know as the Comforter, which means "one who comes alongside." It is his nature to encourage.
- If we have the Holy Spirit we to will be encouragers.

Related Concepts / Encouragement leads to unity. Building up instead of tearing down. Encouragement should be a daily thing in our lives.

6. Live in Unity with One Another

Key Verse / **2 Corinthians 13:11** / Finally, brothers, rejoice. Aim for restoration, comfort *one another*, agree *with one another*, live in peace; and the God of love and peace will be with you.

Q1 / Where is unity found? What are the options of sources of unity? What is the correct answer?

Q2 / Why is restoration part of this discussion? Why is comfort?

Q3 / Why would confessing our sins to each other, James 5:16, be helpful in keeping unity?

Task / Consider the verses below that help us to understand the scope of unity and the means of unity and God's desire for unity. After reading these things write down three ways we can be unified with each other as Christians...

Theological Reasons for the Command

- We mirror the unity of the Trinity when we live in harmony with each other.
- We should live in unity because the Lord made us one in Christ. We are one even though different (Ephesians 2:14), we are One body (Romans 12:4-5).
- Our unity is found in the mind of Christ (Philippians 2:1-11) and is shown through humility. If we find a single human mind (or perhaps a small cadre of minds) that becomes our standard (a leader, a pastor) and push for others to submit to that mind we find ourselves in dangerous pastures.
- We need to be unified because we need each other in Christ.
- We live in harmony because God wants us to.

7. Meet with One Another

Key Verse / Hebrews 10:25 / *Not neglecting to meet together, as in the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the day approaching.*

Q / How important is it that we gather together as Christians? Is it dispensable? Is it commanded?

Task 1 / Consider the verses below, both the ones that have the idea of “one another” present and the ones that are additional cross references. What are the important features of “meeting together?” Can you list a few?

Task 2 / Another word found in these verses is the idea of hospitality. This is not inviting people over to see your dishes and nice house, it is in the Greek *philoxenia* / a love of strangers. What might this mean and how might it relate to the idea of meeting together?

Theological Reasons for the Command

- God has perfect fellowship within the Godhead.
- Through Jesus we have been made to have fellowship with God.
- The church is the *ekklesia*, the gathered, the called out ones.
- We are unified together in the body of Christ and are made for that fellowship / *koinonia*

8. Teach One Another

Key Verse / Romans 15:14 / I myself and satisfied about you, my brothers, that you yourselves are full of goodness, filled with all knowledge and able to *instruct one another*.

Theological Reasons for the Command

- God teaches us through the Word and the indwelling Holy Spirit so that we are able to teach others.

But exhort *one another* every day, as long as it is called "today," that none of you may be hardened by the deceitfulness of sin.

Hebrews 10:25

not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging *one another*, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near.

Hebrews 13:1

Let brotherly love continue.

1 Peter 4:9

Show hospitality to *one another* without grumbling.

1 John 1:7

But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship with *one another*, and the blood of Jesus his Son cleanses us from all sin.

8. Teach One Another

Romans 15:14

I myself am satisfied about you, my brothers, that you yourselves are full of goodness, filled with all knowledge and able to instruct *one another*.

Colossians 3:16

Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly, teaching and admonishing *one another* in all wisdom, singing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, with thankfulness in your hearts to God.

1 Thessalonians 4:9

Now concerning brotherly love you have no need for anyone to write to you, for you yourselves have been taught by God to love *one another*,

1 Timothy 1:3

As I urged you when I was going to Macedonia, remain at Ephesus so that you may charge certain persons not to teach any different doctrine,

2 Timothy 2:2

and what you have heard from me in the presence of many witnesses entrust to faithful men, who will be able to teach others also.

Titus 2:1

But as for you, teach what accords with sound doctrine.

James 3:1

Not many of you should become teachers, my brothers, for you know that we who teach will be judged with greater strictness.

9. Worship With One Another

Ephesians 5:19

addressing *one another* in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody to the Lord with your heart,

Romans 15:6

that together you may with one voice glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Ephesians 5:18–20

And do not get drunk with wine, for that is debauchery, but be filled with the Spirit, addressing *one another* in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody to the Lord with your heart, giving thanks always and for everything to God the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ.
